Note: These factory marks were all hand-painted in cobalt blue under-glaze through 1772 when a stamped factory mark began to be used in addition to the hand-painted marks. Also, these marks were used in multiple variations, and generally accompanied by other Meissen marks indicating dating and throwers, decorators, designers, and molders.

These date marks were imprinted, and in addition to the Meissen factory marks.

Beginning in 1980 alphabet letters were used, (as shown), an 1990 was L, 1991 M, etc. until 2004 when the alphabet started again, but in lower case, ie. 2004 – a, 2005 = b, etc.



These Chinese-looking marks have been affirmed to be from the 1800 – 1825 period, mostly in the years 1817 – 1820
